Character descriptions:

Officer Lockstock – (M 30-50) The play's narrator: a Dudley Doorright presence with a menacing charm.

Officer Barrel – (M 30-50) Side kick to Lockstock

Penelope Pennywise – (F 40-50) Jaded and self-serving with a heart of gold underneath. She harbors a secret.

Bobby Strong – (M 20s) The young classical hero and sacrificial lamb of the play.

Little Sally – (F 20-40) Counter point & "asst. narrator" to Lockstock. Child or child-like w/ an old soul & wry humor.

Caldwell B. Cladwell (M 50-60) – The villainous mogul of the piece.

Hope Cladwell (F 20s) - The ingénue and heroine.

Senator Fipp – (M 30-60) Stereotypical politician – self-serving and made of teflon.

Josephine Strong (F 40-60) – Part of the chorus, but turns out to be Bobby's devoted mother.

Mr. McQueen (M 30-60) – One of Cladwell's henchmen. (Actor will also play one of the "poor.")

Old Man Strong (M 40- 60) – Bobby's father who dies early on and comes back as a ghost. (Actor can play more than one part.)

Tiny Tom (M 20-30) – Sidekick to Old Man Strong – also becomes a ghost. (Actor can play more than one part.)

Chorus: (No age specs) Some actors will play both "poor" and "rich" roles.
